RECORD RESEARCH GOES DIGITAL By Charlie Reinhart

Joel Whitburn and Record Research have entered the digital age with their latest release, which can be purchased in the current KRC sale of books at 40% of it's regular price. This special DVD-ROM contains all 962 "Honor Roll of Hits" charts published by *Billboard* between March 24, 1945 and November 16, 1963.

Before the advent of the "Hot 100" chart, the "Honor Roll of Hits" was considered *Billboard*'s lead chart. It combined all

cover versions of a song into one consolidated listing. As an example, on the December 26, 1959, *Mack the Knife* is the #7 song. Under **Best Selling Record**, Bobby Darin is listed. Under **Records Available** are listed versions by Louis Armstrong, Owen Bradley, The Dick Hyman Trio, The Eric Rodgers Trio, Caterina Valente, Billy Vaughn, The Australian Jazz Quartet, Fred Skinner and Eric Heckscher. Label and release numbers are given for each record. As a further example, *That'll Be the Day* was a huge hit for Buddy Holly and the Crickets in 1957. But, did you know, there were also versions by The Ravens, Jeff Allen, Connie Russell and Buddy Holly and the Three Tunes (Holly's 1856 pre-Crickets' recording)?

Looks like they'll be lots of great reading in this one and, because there are no printing charges, the cost of the volume has also been kept low. If this one sells well, maybe, Whitburn will decide to put out more charts in this format in the near future.

One word of caution before you decide to purchase this one. You need a computer in order to use it. All charts are in JPEG or PDF format and will not play on any consumer DVD decks.

Columbia Band Founder Has Passed Away By Phil Schwartz

Donald "Duck" Hunter, founding member of Little Duck and The Drakes, formerly of Columbia, passed away September 3rd at the age of 68. Raised by his aunt and uncle, the late Mary and Mel Nace, "Duck's" early interest in music, particularly doo-wop group harmony led him to get together with fellow Columbians Reed Dambach, Ronnie Aungst, Gordy Snyder, and Charlie Brinkman to form Little Duck & The Drakes in 1960. "Bo" Eddy, Glen Carvell, Bobby Nolt, and Bill Teats, were other well-known local musicians who teamed with the group over the years.

They released two 45's, "Ramblin' Guy"/"Blue Velvet" on Kingston Records in 1965, and "Every Beat Of My Heart"/"Take A Trip" on Pee-Vee Records in 1966. These tracks, along with the unreleased tracks "Forever" and "Darling Lorraine" (which featured "Duck" on lead) were released on the CD compilation *Stompin' Time Again* in 1999.

The group got back together for the release of this CD, and subsequently performed at KRC related events at The Host, The Chameleon Club, and The Village. Lifelong friend and supporter Steve Lapore, Jr. served as manager of the group. Brigitte Walton became the newest singer in the group during this period, and is featured with original members Hunter, Snyder, and Dambach, on their CD *Getting Our Ducks In A Row*, released in 2005. Brinkman passed away in 2002. "Duck" was also a featured vocalist in the big band group "Sound Of Roses", and enjoyed photography, in addition to his full-time work as an accountant at ITT Engineered Valves. He is survived by wife Barbara Ginder Hunter, a daughter, Angelia, and a granddaughter Sarah Marie.

IT'S OFFICIAL: NEW HOME FOR KRC SHOWS

While many of you were still driving home from the September 9th show, the club was experiencing problems that led up to being forced to find a new venue to call home.

Lancaster Catholic High School is switching their cafeteria seating to round tables that fold in the middle and contain "fixed stools". While this may be more convenient for custodial staff, it has not been popular with their student body and obviously not useable for shows and events such as the **Pennsylvania Music Expo**.

The Lancaster Catholic Business Manager was supposed to attend our club meeting that immediately followed the September show to discuss table arrangement options. He did not show up or attempt to contact officers to cancel his appearance. It was only 45 minutes AFTER the meeting that Site Coordinator Bob "Will" Williams received a call from the Business Manager treating him like a misbehaved teenager informing Will everything had to be back in pre-show order. This was without ANY assistance to help change-out the room and without proper equipment to move these unfriendly tables easily in and out of the room. (AUTHOR'S NOTE: I though "we" were the customer!)

Your entire officer team sprang into action, tirelessly working, exploring various sites in a five county area (Lancaster, York, Cumberland, Dauphin and Lebanon.) Many locations were contacted and ruled out for one or more reasons. Visits were made to over a half dozen potentially viable options from more than 50+ on a master list. This took place for the two weeks immediately following the September show.

After 12½ years, 145 consecutive monthly shows and a boat load of rental payments, our 28 year tradition has a new venue to call home. It is the 6,200 square foot <u>air conditioned</u> Pennsylvania Jaycees Bingo Hall, 2460 New Holland Pike, five miles east of our former home. Thanks to Past Treasurer and former KRC member, Jack Coons for suggesting this location. (He is extremely knowledgeable about Lancaster County.) Your presi-

"We're delighted to have the Keystone Record Collectors in our hall", said Jackie Cornelius, Business and Operations Manager with the Pennsylvania Jaycees Bingo Hall. She continued, "Their **Pennsylvania Music Expo** is a well established music show that will fit nicely with our operation." The Jaycees run bingo twice a week, every Wednesday and Friday evening.

dent, Bill Donohue was first on the scene to check it out. To-

day was the first show in our new, cozier, room.

You owe your entire office team a <u>huge token</u> of your gratitude. They were able to find a new location and negotiate an agreement, without missing a show, allowing for a seamless transition. Don't forget to thank them when you see one of them. The next time you have a criticism, think first before you speak. Plan to get further involved in YOUR club by attending the business meeting after EVERY OTHER show.

WHAT'S IN STORE FOR CUSTOMERS, VENDORS AND MEMBERS?

- Arr There are approximately the same number of tables (95+, $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 6 foot size).
- ♪ With the move, there is no increase in table rent!
- ↑ There are 87 parking spaces at the building that is also occupied by the Pennsylvania Fabric Outlet. (There is no parking in front of their main entrance.)
- ${f J}$ Overflow parking is accommodated by using Lancaster Laboratories parking.
- ${f J}$ There is a special parking lot for dealers, on the west side of the building.
- There are two sets of load/unload doors into the room.
- $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{f}}$ The building features flush load in/load out with no steps to navigate.
- ♪ Dealer table location will be as close as possible to the current configuration, allowing customers to easily find them.

- J Dealers must leave their area clean or be fined or not asked to participate again.
- A functioning Public Address system is used to make announcements throughout the day.
- $\mbox{\it 1}$ There is space for an on-site vendor (outside) providing food, snacks, and beverages.
- ♪ Other food options in the area include: Golden Market (ATM also), Leola Family Restaurant, Rosario's Pizza, Dunkin' Donuts and Baskin Robbins. There is also an ATM in the Meadowbrook Shopping Center.
- ♪ Lodging is available at: Sunset Valley Motor Inn, phone 717-656-2091, website: http://www.sunsetvalleymotel.com/ It is located two blocks away from the show site.
