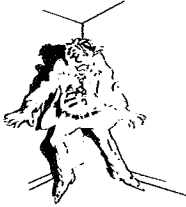

"1992 has gone and KRC has survived an inevitable, but risky, decision to leave the familiar and established confines of Columbia to relocate our shows a half hour eastward.

Although we lost some attendees from Columbia, we noticed an increase in people from Delaware, eastern Pennsylvania and Maryland. Those areas, such as Philadelphia, West Chester, Exton, Wilmington, Elkton, etc., should supply many future members.

Now that we are settled in our spacious new quarters, we need to address problems. The tremendous expense (over \$4000) to purchase tables forced our club to curtail advertising and reallocate funds which would have promoted our new location effectively. Thanks to you the word got out and most KRC regulars followed to the new location. The attendance at 1992 shows was somewhat erratic and club leaders have designated promotion as a priority item in 1993.

Again, we are counting on each member to tell people about KRC and circulate our flyers, which remain our most cost-effective advertising.

**Derek Shaw** gave a KRC flyer to a *Wilmington News Journal* columnist and she featured KRC in print as 'Final Source for Vinyl.' As a result of that column, KRC got one new member and at least four new visitors to the January show. Another 50 people sent for our free flyer on disposing of record collections! 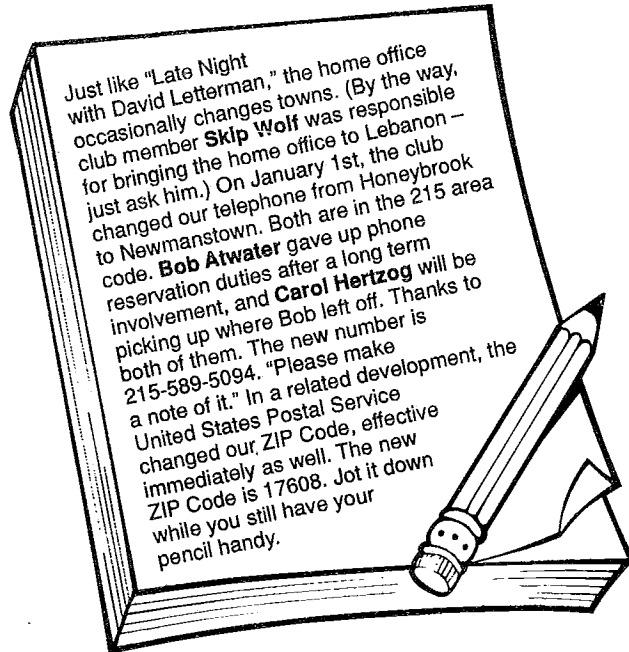

## WELCOME ABOARD MASON-DIXON SHOW

With the KRC show leaving Columbia last year, and the York and Mechanicsburg shows dissolving, it became apparent that there should be some type of show on the west side of the Susquehanna River to fill in the gap. Recently KRC and MMC (Maryland Music Collectors) members **Ray Quigley** and **Derek Shaw** decided to take the matter into their own hands and put on a show twice a year at the Alert Fire Company in Emigsville PA (just south of York). The show is not sponsored by either the KRC or MMC, but has the support of both clubs. The intention is *NOT* to compete with either club, rather to supplement their activities. 1993 dates will be May 2nd and September 5th. Welcome aboard. Yet another shopping opportunity for our members.

## A KRC FIRST

When the club began hosting shows 13 years ago, the forefathers decided to hold ten shows a year, skipping February and August. The reason: Too cold (bad weather) in February and too hot (vacations) in August. It also acted as a marketing device to guarantee well-attended March and September shows.

Since the late 1980's our attendance has been consistent (700 to 1000 each time). Now, starting in 1993, we begin a new chapter in our history: The second Sunday of *every* month (except April 18th) including February and August. Will it work? Will the crowds support it? With your help, support and endorsement, they should.

## RSI: R.I.P.

At press time, *Key Notes* had just received word that Record Source International has gone bankrupt. The mineral Well TX concern (once owned by *Billboard* magazine) was the premiere source for current 45 product (see Newsletter #65). In a letter sent to subscribers they said, "Due to the lack of support, the rapid conversion to CDs, the resistance of the record labels to select one central source for 7" vinyl, and escalating costs of shipments, we ran out of money and our secured creditors have foreclosed our assets."

This is a major blow to the 45 user. Ideally, someone or some company will come forward to take over the operation. As details develop, we'll keep you informed. If anyone has information on other subscription services for current releases, please let us know.

## THANKS, KAI

Effective immediately, all current KRC members in good standing, setting up as vendors at any International CD sponsored shows, will get a reduced rate on tables. **Kai Kates**, who has been doing KRC shows since the mid 1980's, offers the discount as a token of his thanks for the success he's enjoyed at our shows. **Kai** promotes shows at three locations, three to four times each year. The locations include Wilkes-Barre, Allentown and Ft. Washington. Yet another benefit for your membership dollars.

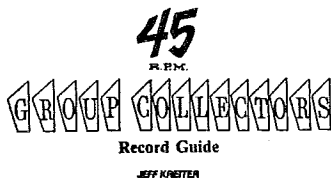
