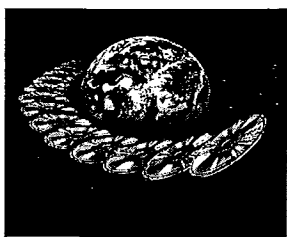

No Lie... "Love Songs" is Good

A local artist CD review by B. Derek Shaw

Consider this: You're the Promotion Director of one of the highest rated radio stations in the fifth largest metropolitan area in the country. You're doing the morning show, making major market bucks. In 1988, you're named National Promotion Director of the Year. Would you give it up to perform? Jack Quigley did.



York native Quigley spent 13 years in broadcasting (WRHY-Starview 92; WEZX-Scranton; WYSP and WMMR-Philadelphia) and gave it all up to do what he likes best – entertain and sing for people.

He released a tape in 1991 called "It's a Quigley Thing, You Wouldn't Understand." The 13 tunes, all penned or co-written by Quigley, are a mixed bag of ballads, blues, two-steps and instrumentals. Two tracks, "Family Reunion" (my favorite) and "Mona Wants to Dance," received some national airplay on college and commercial stations.

Two years later, Quigley is back, better than ever, with a slick, well-produced, balanced, enjoyable offering, boasting 12 original tracks. "Love Songs and Other Lies" leans more toward a progressive acoustic folk sound. There are interspersive cuts ("Sweet Marie," "The Farmer's Daughter," "That's How We're Getting Along"), party tunes ("Is This Any Way for a Man to Behave?," "Drinking with them Coney Dogs," "Sick n' Tired of Being Sick n' Tired") and a highly commercial ditty, "Dallastown" – yes, it's referring to the Southern York County community.

This CD is a must for anyone looking for a breath of fresh air in this current void of good music. "Love Songs and Other Lies" covers different parts of our lives. Quigley's outstanding singing and guitar playing really shines through on this release.

All the songs were written or co-written by Jack and Paul (Governor Iko) Hamilton, a long time friend, who also is a 1978 York College graduate. They met there and have been friends ever since.

The music is great. However, Quigley's performances are memorable. When he's not performing in New Orleans, Philadelphia, or other parts unknown, he's back in York, putting on a show for the hometown folks.

Seeing Quigley in action is like combining the styles of John Prine, James Taylor and an occasional Tom Waits performance with the Keystone Kops. He's fun to watch and listen to.

Should you get this release? Absolutely. Will radio stations play it? They should, if they want some quality, fresh music. Did Jack make the right decision? I think so. He knows so.

Daydream Believer

In a cynical comment on the times, John Lennon once said the Beatles were bigger than Jesus Christ.

Now, three decades later, a man who made a living doing crude Fab Four impersonations claims the Monkees in 1993 are bigger than the Beatles.

Not that they'll ever make the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, mind you. Nor should they.

But Davy Jones has a point, in that some little kids only know the rock they see and hear on narrow format stations today.

Take Davy's four-year old daughter, for instance, who regularly watches old rerun episodes of the Monkees program on TV. When her Monkee daddy asks her who the short little Monkee is singing the lead in "Daydream Believer," she replies, "Oh, that's my other daddy."

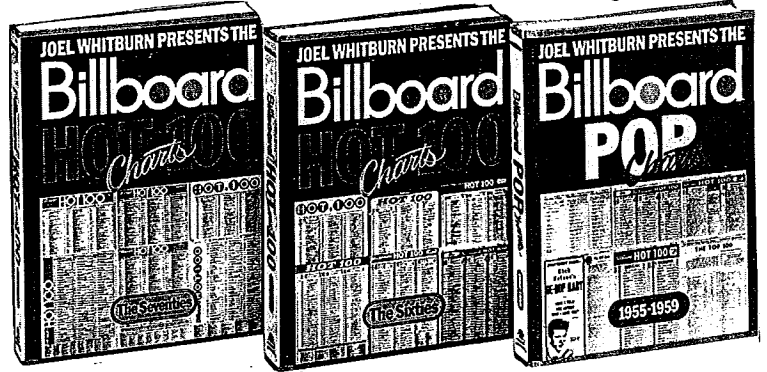
