Spring and summer signal warmer weather, outside activities and road construction on just about every major highway in Pennsylvania. Route 30 has been immune for some time, now it's her turn in the Lancaster area.

Route 30, between the Route 283 junction near Park City Center and the junction with US 222 to Reading is the three mile corridor that is being widened and rebuilt. When completed, service roads will also be added to keep surface traffic off Route 30 when possible. What does all this mean to PA Music Expo customers?

If you are traveling from Philadelphia, New Jersey, Reading or Allentown, you should start using the New Holland Pike exit off 30 to Fountain Avenue, make the right to the cafeteria lot on the left. If you are traveling from Harrisburg, York, Maryland or other points west, eventually you will probably have to take an alternate route. When we get word on closures and detours we will pass it on to you and provide detour maps when we can. Temporary inconvenience, permanent improvement. We'll see if PennDOT is right.




Blitz Plans Autograph Blitz at July KRC Show

If you are a history buff, oldies music enthusiast and/or television fan, next month's show promises to be a great one. Stan Blitz from Scottsdale, Arizona has written a book that doesn't rewrite history, just corrects it. The West Philadelphia native has spent 14 years researching his subject. On July 13, you can find out for yourself what all the fuss is about. Bandstand, The Untold Story is a book that provides insightful reading about the person 92 percent of the population isn't familiar with, and don't realize was the first host, Bob Horn.



The majority of our population think Dick Clark was the first host of *Bandstand*, which started on local TV in 1952. The fact is that he inherited a successful show 5-1/2 years out. This book can be called a non-fiction historical mystery. It is the story of how the station management of one TV station created a very popular Delaware Valley show, and midstream decided to change horses for a more youthful Dick Clark (whose father just happened to be tight with station personnel). This stunt to dishonor, discredit and fire Horn ultimately forced him to move away, change his name and work a lesser job. The book contains more than 155 photographs, many that have been buried away for over 40 years.

Stan will be on hand most of the day to sell and autograph books, and reminisce about those formative years of rock and roll. Tell all your fellow music collectors. This is one autograph party you won't want to miss.

An Offer Ten Years In The Making!

It's hard to believe that it only took us ten years to get around to offering this fabulous resource publication to our members again (see *Newsletter* #51). Long time supporter of the KRC, Ken Clee from Stak-O-Wax is publisher of the definitive, most up-to-date and complete source of information for the collector. *The Directory of American 45 RPM Records* contains 4,000 pages listing over one million titles! The work covers 1947-1996.

The reference book is actually four volumes. The first book contains 500+ discographies of artists and includes all known American 45 releases, in the order of their release, with their B-sides listed and great info on unreleased tracks and associated releases by individual members of groups. Keep in mind the Whitburn series of books only cover *charted* singles – these books cover much more. The information is current through the end of 1996.

Books 2 and 4 include every label that had at least ten issues. Releases are listed in order with both sides. Alternate flips and unreleased numbers are listed, when known. You'll find more than 1,500 label listings with disc-dating information, where known.

Volume 3 includes the major labels, using the same format as Volumes 2 and 4, with disc-dating information.

The best is yet to come. This 20th Anniversary edition goes for \$195 postpaid. Stak-O-Wax has agreed to provide the series to any KRC member for only \$165 postpaid, for a limited time!

If you're a serious 45 collector, this is one publication you need!



Pastime - Acappella A CD Review by Kenny Schreiber



Pastime is an up-and-coming acappella vocal group from Harrisburg. The lead vocals are expertly shared by all members of the group. In this self-produced 22-track, one hour CD, the emphasis is clearly on doo-wop, and that seems to be the group's forté.

Pastime's covers of classics by the Paragons, Danleers, Dreamlovers, Dubs and other 50s vocal groups are right on the money. I particularly enjoyed *One Summer Night, If I Should Lose You,* and *Please Don't Ask Me To Be Lonely.* Pastime even performs some lesser known "collector's classics" such as the Keystone's *Seven Wonders of the World.*

This group has been together since 1993, performing in Eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey. The lineup inludes Bill Healis, Don Schwanger, Ron Hoerner, Gordy Geesey and Buddy Scharff.



Of particular note is what might be the shortest song ever. The last track is appropriately titled *The Ending!* and clocks in at only 40 seconds. Grab this CD while you can and you might have a future collector item.
