Customers, dealers, KRC members and general curiosity-seekers were all pleased and amazed at what they found at the January 11th show, at our new location in Blue Ball. Not only was the floor level, tables uniform, lighting great and unloading a breeze, there was also PARKING, and lots of it! There is even a separate remote parking lot for dealers. Although attendance was down (approximately 600), enthusiasm was up. The lower figure was attributed to only getting an ad in one of the dozen papers we work with, a new location, Super Bowl playoffs as well as a sagging economy. At least a dozen club members participated in the move to Blue Ball, prior to our January 11th debut. Thanks to Billy Stump, Charlie and Erna Reinhart, Bob Bretz, Rich and Linda Lehman, Paul Hamilton, Steve Yohe, Bob Atwater, Denny Emerick, John Orlousky, and others.

Ken Swigart, a long time member and record collector extraordinaire, made a cameo appearance. Says Ken, "I made it to the first one in Columbia (13 years ago), so I had to make it to Blue Ball, too."

MarketMaster **Steve Yohe** again garnered more publicity for the club, this time in the January 29th edition of the Lancaster *Intelligencer Journal* newspaper. The extensive article talked about the club, our new show location, and about Steve's involvement with collecting.

The February issue of WITF-TV's magazine finally hit the streets with the KRC article included. The piece, written by honorary member **Phil Eberly**, nicely conveyed our story, as well at whetting the appetites of many who are just finding out about our club for the first time.

The day the issue hit the newsstands, I was besieged with phone calls wanting to know more about our unique organization. "KRC finished the 1991 year with a balance of nearly \$1000 in our treasury. Much of this will be used up quickly to help publicize our move to the Blue Ball Market so that our old members can find us and, hopefully also draw in some new buyers and potential members.

The \$5 surcharge that has been placed on table rentals will be used to pay back a \$4000 loan the club had to make in order to buy and transport the tables to our new location. We hope to have the loan paid off by the July show. Our landlord at Blue Ball will also be renting our room for other events on days when we're not using it. The club will receive rent for the use of our tables. This rent money will also be applied to our loan balance. The quicker we pay off our loan, the quicker table rents will get back to their normal level."

A PAIR OF CLUBS



With the success of the Keystone Record Collectors Club as well as the current boon in nostalgia, a couple of new "swap" groups are forming. Both groups drew on the formula the KRC used when we were first forming.

First, in the south, the "Cool Cats Club" is a group specializing in '50s culture. Plans include holding meetings in members' homes with music, speakers and memorabilia collecting. They also plan to hold impromptu dances and teach group dance lessons (Madison, Stroll, Bop, Jitterbug, etc.) as well as coordinate travel to record shows and concerts. Moving north, this next association started in April of 1990, but more formally got organized last month. "The Lost and Found Record Review Session" is an opportunity for doo-wop, R&B, group, and soul collectors to delve more into their area of interest by getting turned on to songs they may not be familiar with. Each month, attendees bring five songs (45s or LPs) they think are obscure from the above categories, including B-sides. Then time is allotted to play them for the rest of the group. It's an excellent way for you to increase your musical knowledge. The next meet is scheduled for Sunday, March 8th at the White Rose VFW, Eberts Lane (near Baughman Auto Salvage). FOLLOWING OUR LEAD

Three years ago, the KRC adopted a policy of eliminating the sale of bootleg videos and cassettes at our shows. If you notice any problems in this area, please contact one of the officers. Now the other promoters along the East Coast are starting to follow suit. More and more shows don't allow or allow fewer dealers with this kind of merchandise. That's great. On top of that, more and more people are touting our show as THE place to find good, collectible product. They're not finding it in Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Baltimore, or places in between. But they are finding it in Blue Ball. Who says smaller doesn't mean better?

ASSOCIATION FORMING

With all the increased show activity in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, Connecticut and Maryland, a half-dozen promoters got together and are organizing the Mid-Atlantic Promoters Association. Some of the areas is group is attempting to cover include site and date coordination, promotional coordination and cooperation, problem solving and dealer standards. At press time, the initial meeting had not been held, but it was hoped it would be a coffee club-type meeting, involving as many promoters in this region as possible. Floyd, who had some respiratory problems, died at St. Joe's Hospital in Lancaster. Our deepest sympathy to his family. He will be missed.


