One thing that does not change for 1993 are dues. The membership rate will remain a bargain (for the third straight year) at \$12. That's a deal in these recessionary times!


In other news, people are finally starting to come through with material for *Key Notes*. After years of pulling teeth, the effort has worked. In this

"We are pleased to note that several people have begun to help publicize our club. As a result, media attention is increasing. Mark Wyatt and Steve Clark arranged to have freelance writer Mark Marymont attend the September show to write an article on record collecting for the Philadelphia Inquirer. That publicity should provide valuable (and free!) "eastern" exposure to a market largely unaware of our club. Long-time show attendee Jack Eisen of WITF-TV channel 33 in Harrisburg visited the October show with a cameraman and interviewed many people for a ten-minute television feature story. Kommander Kool of KOOL-FM broadcasted live from the October show and promoted upcoming show dates. Since we are a non-profit organization with a rather limited budget for advertising, each of us should be looking for opportunities to promote the club. Our cheapest advertising is the club flyer. Be sure to take some to each show and distribute in your area. Tell your friends how great our shows are. Your participation will help us to continue to present the BEST show around."

"As of our October show we had a total membership of 307. Of these, 109 were new members. Taking into consideration that not everyone rejoins each year, plus the relocation to the Blue Ball Market, we did lose and gain members. This tally remains consistant with previous years.

The new year is gradually approaching for renewal. Your renewal form (along with your ballot for 1993 officers) will be mailed to you after the December show. Nominations will be taken during the November and December business meetings. Also, keep in mind that a gift certificate is a great Christmas gift idea for record enthusiasts!"

"The final payment has been made for the club's 125 tables! The final payment was made following the October 11th show. Beginning with the November show, the club's treasury should begin to return to the levels it had achieved several years ago. We have been operating for the past two years with very little reserve cash. Fortunately, no unforseen costly items have been encountered. However, your officers will feel much more comfortable with a reserve of \$1000-\$2000 in the bank. This should allow us to purchase sleeves, bags, etc., on a more regular basis, advertise more often and put out club publications on a more regular basis."

# A BOOK REVIEW BY BILL STUMP "SAVAGE LOST – FLORIDA GARAGE BANDS: THE 60s AND BEYOND" by Jeffrey M. Lemlich


When I was approached to read and review this book, I was excited. This contains (almost) all the information you'll ever need to know concerning 60s Florida rock. Mr. Lemlich writes in depth about local Florida record label discographies, names of the personnel in the various garage bands, as well as even reading dead wax markings!

I was intrigued, and the book brought back many memories of those long lost days (daze!) in the Sunshine State. Starting with the early 60s, throughout the 70s and even into the 80s, everything concerning the Florida rock music scene is chronicled, examined, explained, then discussed, which made for great reading. I highly recommend this book for anyone collecting obscure 60s and 70s rock 45s. I believe all music fans would enjoy reading this book.



## **NEWSLETTER REVIEWS**

There are a pair of newsletters that we're going to spotlight in this issue of *Key Notes*. Both have been in business for some time, and both deserve your attention.

Greg Milewski is young. He knows it. However, after getting into a discussion on 50s and early 60s music with him, one learns in a minute or two that Greg's knowledge, interest and understanding of this era is quite comprehensive. Five years ago, Greg created *Cat Tales*, a 100% non-profit big beat music 'zine. Each 12-16 page issue, published quarterly, is crammed with lots of useful information, interviews and related advertising. Recent issues have featured articles on James Dean, the Quintones, shag dancing, the Cleftones, Hal Roach, the Danleers and Screamin' Jay Hawkins. Most issues contain a Letters To The Editors column, guest columnists, and a record/CD review. The newsletter is not splashy, but Greg's artwork adds zest to the overall presentation. Just a few miles up the road from the site of the Central Pennsylvania Music Expo, is the world headquarters of the American Bandstand Fan Club. # CLUB PARTICIPATION OPENS ANOTHER STORE




