

Roy Robbins - VP. Roy has been involved in a variety of activities for the club. He is now working with the 11 newspapers we advertise in, making sure the correct ad runs on the right date. Ron Diehl - Secretary. Ron was appointed Acting Secretary of the club by the rest of the officers in April to fill the unexpired term of Rusty Habel. Ron has been busy getting our membership records up to date. He took care of obtaining 1988 membership cards (enclosed). Ron is in the process of compiling the results of our 1988 renewal member survey. In addition, he will be recording minutes at all business meetings, and posting a copy on the club bulletin board at each show.

From **Bob Atwater**, **Treasurer**. "Most people know me as the marketmaster at the Columbia Market house shows. Now I'm addressing you as your cub treasurer. This is my first term as an elected officer in e eight years that I've been a member.

Our record keeping requirements are much more involved that when we first started. In addition, since we've been incorporated as a non-profit corporation in 1986, that brought on additional reporting responsibilities. Also, we are fortunate to have our own club sponsored show, which has become an "A" show in everyones book.

Our checkbook balance as of May 31st stood at \$3,492.35. This does not include all of the newspaper advertising and other bills associated with the May show. I will provide a complete income and expense breakdown in the next newsletter."

# **NEWS YOU CAN USE**

The officers recently decided that to maintain the integrity of our show, all members that set up will need to sign a KRC Policy Statement. This waiver protects our club in terms of liability, taxes, and bonds. Also it states that the club is not promoting the sale of counterfeit items. Club Secretary Ron Diehl will be around during the June show to get your signature on the document to be kept in our files. Those setting up after the June show will see Marketmaster Bob Atwater before they set up. In the future, we will do this on an annual basis at the January show. Again, this is protecting your club from any unforseen circumstances.

Club member Charlie Reinhart, who had been hosting the popular *Breakfast with the Beatles* Sunday morning music show for the past three years, recently had his show cancelled. The show had consistently been receiving high ratings and rave reviews. It appears that the west coast consultants to WQXA find that the Beatles are no longer a marketable item, and recommended ALL Beatles music be dropped from their format, including Charlie's show. I feel the Beatles still are a viable group in 1988.


