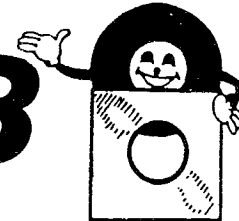
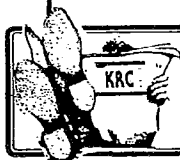

## 1988 in Review

This is a good time of the year, while the old one is still fresh in my mind and the new one still fresh, to take a look at where we have been, what we have done, and what 1989 holds for the Keystone Record Collectors. I've enjoyed the year I've served as KRC president - not thoroughly, but mostly. As I mentioned in my first column, it was (and still is) my goal to fine tune the organization. When we stop fine tuning and become too sure of ourselves, that will be the beginning of the end. I've tried to continue the great work started by **ROY ROBBINS, STEVE YOHE, and TOM GROSH.**

1988 was a year of both accomplishments and failures for KRC and the music industry in general. On a positive note the single biggest success was our highly attended and near sell out shows (700 - 900 people attending, 55 - 59 dealers participating). This just goes to prove that you do not have to have a show in a fancy hotel in a major city to be a success. If you have the right people with the right stock, customers will seek you out. Other successes include: **BOB ATWATER's** handling of our financial books and records (The best they've been in ten years! I could barely balance the checkbook when I was Treasurer.) **BOB** has done a tremendous job. The next time you see him, thank him for his efforts, and

Continuing, The KRC Good Ole Days Swap Meet was well received, we now sport a typeset newsletter (THANKS **DAVE HOFFER!**), **PHIL SCHWARTZ** produced two **RECORDER** magazines, **JERRY MacNEISH** sold his new surf instrumental LP, **CLASS ACT** held an autograph party, the late **TED HESBACHER's** personal record collection was appraised and sold per his wishes (see November Newsletter). This past year also saw the Kit-Kats get back together, and the Valley Forge Music Fair hosted three outstanding Doo-Wop Concerts. Hats off to **VFMF!** We also continued to sell KRC merchandise along with other music related books and supplies from a new consolidated KRC table (#114 - 115), and **ROY ROBBINS** did a fine job on club PR and Newspaper relations.

On the down side of things we saw the cancellation of **CHARLIE RINEHART's** "Breakfast with The Beatles" radio show on **WQXA** (if you think of it give them a call or drop them a line even now and rattle their cage, what the hell). Also, the Columbia Police and Hinkle's Pharmacy were always upset about over anxious shoppers and unobservant dealers who parked (**AND CONTINUE TO PARK**) in the wrong places. 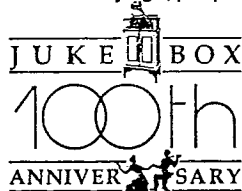

## KRC 1/10 th AS OLD

This year, as you know, marks the tenth anniversary of the founding of our club. In addition, 1989 marks the 100th anniversary of the juke box. Just a century ago, people put a nickel in a coin operated machine known



as a nickelodeon or a player-piano type of equipment to hear their favorite musical selection. This later developed into what we now know as the juke box which has become the staple of every bar, restaurant, lounge, bowling alley, and other places where people get together. To commemorate this milestone, RCA records is pressing all the 45 RPM singles they manufacture this year with the 100th anniversary logo (below). **HAPPY BIRTHDAY and KEEP ON PLAYING!** Note: Any members that would like to do an article on juke boxes or send a picture of one in their collection, we will be happy to run it.

## YOU CAN HELP

If you're a member from the greater York, Lancaster, or Harrisburg area, we really can use a little leg work from you. ## FACES IN THE CROWD

Many members may remember the York record store near the corner of Market and Queen Streets as MISS BEAT RECORDS. TONY & CINDY GOWL, looking for new adventures, sold their shop on September 1st to KIM & LARRY GARLAND. The shop now has a new name and different merchandise. FLASH & TRASH features rock and punk clothing and accessories as well as the best in metal, hardcore, punk, and industrial music. The 1,000 square foot store also has great bargains on older rock LP's as well. Be sure to check out the 203 East Philadelphia Street store the next time you're in York. According to Larry he feels that "Columbia's shows hold up to the biggest ones going - you've got it covered." So does his shop.



Author and club member MAX FUREK is back writing again. His latest composition is a piece called "East Coast Radio Days" that appeared in the December issue of DISCOVERIES Magazine. The article is about the "boss with the sauce, the Geator with the Heater," Jerry

Blavat. Jerry, long known to Philadelphia radio audiences, first started on WHAT, then WCAM and finally WFIL. He also hosted the "Discophonetic TV" show in the mid 60's on WFIL-TV (now WPVI). MAX, a regional music historian, wrote the book, "The Jordan Brothers, a Musical Biography of Rock's Fortunate Sons" a few years ago.



Speaking of authors, PHIL EBERLY is pushing his pencil once again. Phil, who served as General Manager of WSBA radio in York from 1963 - 1982, and authored "Music in the Air - A Radio Perspective," is working on book #2. This time the focus is narrowed to concentrate on the history of the 18 radio stations throughout the country that are part of the Susquehanna Broadcasting Co., Radio Division. WSBA was the flagship station, signing on September 1, 1942, then WARM-AM in Avoca (Wilkes-Barre/Scranton area). Now there are Susquehanna operations in many major markets including: Atlanta, Dallas, Norfolk, Sarasota, and San Francisco among others. The book is scheduled to be out by late summer, and will feature many of the personalities that have worked on the Susquehanna stations throughout the years, along with ample pictures. Our own PHIL SCHWARTZ has supplied a fair amount of material to PHIL EBERLY's upcoming book. Perhaps we can arrange an autograph party at an upcoming KRC show. Stay tuned for details.

Our most successful, yet least expensive form of advertising the KRC shows are our Show Dates Flyers. These little gems (grey for 1989) are distributed at other record shows, and various record stores throughout a five county area. They are also placed in other prominent locations (see YOU CAN HELP article elsewhere in this issue.) Normally by June of each year, we have exhausted our supply and have to re-order, thus a "second pressing." This year BEFORE the year started, we distributed 8,000 and completely depleted our supply!! Late in December, an additional 13,000 were printed. Another record broken by our increasingly popular shows.

## IN THE NEWS

The January 1989 issue of DISCOVERIES (page 46) ran a 1/4 page article along with a 1988 KRC officer photo. The magazine gave a nice plug for the club, mentioned that we are gearing up for our tenth anniversary and encouraged people to contact us by providing our address. 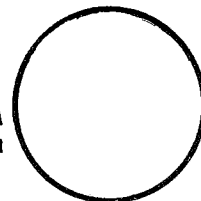


# YOUR ATTENTION, PLEASE

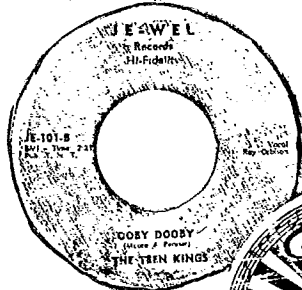
