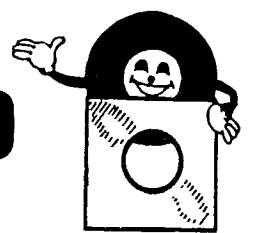
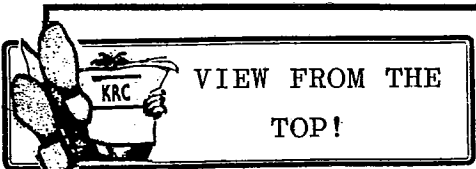

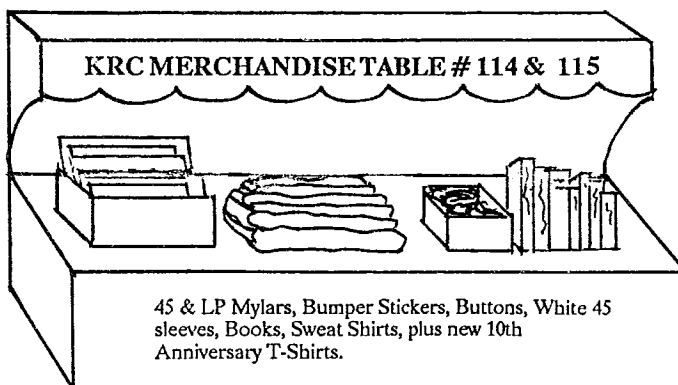

## FACES IN THE CROWD

- Three new record shows were recently held, all put on by KRC members. Since the KRC does not host a February show, two of the shows were held in February for that reason. On February 19th, DENNY McCONNELL & GLEN EAGLE hosted R.O.C.K. (Reading Original Collectors Klub) Record Show. Over 600 people attended the event at the Holiday Inn. Plans are to continue the event with the next one scheduled for August 20th, the other month that KRC does not sponsor a show.
  - The Knights of Columbus in Catonsville was the location for a February 26th show, that was the brainchild of KRC member, RAY QUIGLEY. Nearly 400 people attended this "down home feeling" show. Plenty of food and beverage, along with lots of vinyl kept things hopping.
  - New show #3 was held at the York Sheraton by KRC members, N. PAUL HAMILTON & GARY GILBERTHOP on March 19th. GARY owns and operates Classic Tunes Record Store, who sponsored the event. Since we went to press before the show was held we don't have a count on the number of people who attended.
  - We're glad that our members want to expand the hobby of record collecting by putting on events like these. The club will gladly support and promote any music related event provided it is not in conflict with any KRC scheduled show or event.

- Another KRC member receives television exposure, DAVE HOFFER was interviewed by producers of the Baltimore edition of "EVENING MAGAZINE" for a piece on life in 1969 Baltimore. DAVE talked about the local music scene of that period and displayed some of his extensive 60's and 70's rock memorabilia collection. He also provided local music from 1969 for the show.
- Club membership does have it's rewards. Just ask KRC President B. DEREK SHAW. He was interviewed in December for the extensive article the York Daily Record ran in its York Magazine section. Following the interview he was asked by the Entertainment Editor to become a free-lance correspondent in that department. To date, DEREK has written various music-related articles for the paper, including one on Doc Watson, Sandra Reeves-Phillips (who recreates six late great female jazz singers), a blues festival in Lancaster, and an introductory article to accompany the premier appearance of a syndicated column by Jerry Osborne (price guide publisher and DISCOVERIES editor). "Mr. Music" is now a weekly Friday morning column. Again, KRC involvement does pay off.
- A regular at our near-monthly shows the past couple of years, BILL MARTIN does more than just sell Pfanstahl needles and accessories. BILL is the U.S. representative for Fairport Convention. In addition, he is a contributing editor and sales assistant for DIRTY LINEN, an international journal of folk, folk-rock and traditional music. The Winter 88/89 boasts 80 crammed-filled pages, loaded with all kinds of useful, interesting, and entertaining information. This 24th edition featured NOT LESS THAN 30 new album reviews! DIRTY LINEN is published three times a year, as well as an update published three times as well, between magazine issues. Potential subscribers can write to P.O. Box 66600, Baltimore, MD 21239-6600.
