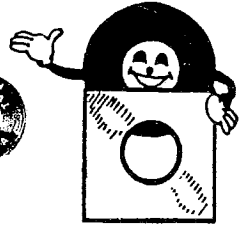


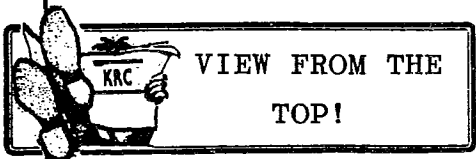

CHARLIE REINHART - TREASURER

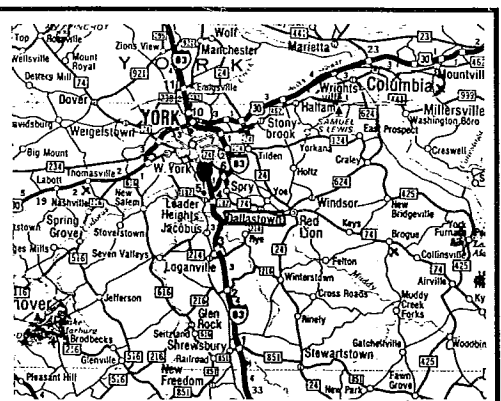
After two months of settling into my new position as treasurer of the KRC, I have discovered that there is quite a bit of work involved in running the club. All of our officers, past and present, deserve a big "thanks" for keeping the club running so well and so smoothly for the past ten years.

I'm glad to report that the club is in good financial shape. We currently have a balance of more than \$3,000, and the market house shows and sale of club items continues to generate profits. Hopefully, much of these funds will be used to the benefit of all KRC members.

KRC GOOD 'OLE DAYS SWAP MEET

Last year's event (hosted by **BOB AND DORIS ATWATER**) received rave reviews, so many in fact that the officers decided to try it again this summer. First KRC club president (and current promotions director) **Roy Robbins** has graciously agreed to provide his home as the location for this year's outing, Sunday, August 27th noon - 6 p.m. Relive the former days when our shows were small, personal, and informal. All you need to bring to participate are some records to trade (LP's, 45's, CD's, tapes, etc.) and your appetite. Plenty of food and conversation will be on

hand that day. Members are welcome to bring their spouse, guest, and/or children, however, we ask that you RSVP with Roy (for a food count) at (717)244-7933 by 8/25. There is no charge to attend this get together, which will be held in lieu of an August KRC show. To get to Roy's house: Take Route 74 south into Dallastown. At the second traffic light turn left onto North Pleasant Avenue (there is an Exxon self-serve station on the corner). Go three blocks to the top of the hill. Turn left onto King Street and go to the end. Roy's house is the 2nd house from the end on the left. (60 East King)



ARE YOU AWARE??

The club now sports a sign board posted at our merchandise table #116 & #117. Club President **DEREK SHAW** was instrumental in obtaining the sign and preparing it for our use. It contains both member and non-member prices for the various items we sell including t-shirts, buttons, paper and plastic sleeves, books, etc. A quick glance at both columns of prices will instantly tell you that KRC membership saves you money.

In late May, two more guys on a record buying spree from England passed through our area looking for soul records. Club member **GARY GILBERTHORP** (Classic Tunes) passed the lead on to club president **DEREK SHAW**. Because of the non-competitive, friendly, and helpful attitude our members have, we were able to steer John and Andy to other members' including: **RUTH FAUS, DUANE & MARY ZEHRING, ANDY KAMM, PHIL SCHWARTZ, BOB ATWATER, JOE WILT, ALONZO KITTRELS** and **JOHN MOORE**. They plan to come back to the states late this summer or in the fall, and plan to do our show and visit other members to see records they have for sale. It is this cooperative attitude among KRC members that help to keep the club alive and strengthen our efforts.

A new internal procedure with show reservations has eliminated many of the previous problems we encountered. Each show is prepaid in advance. This also applies to people on the waiting list. Those wanting to set up must send payment for one space in advance. The waiting list order is determined by the date when prepayment checks are received by our Marketmaster. This system went into effect in April, eliminating many of the problems we experienced in the past and insuring upwards of 100% occupancy on show dates (of usable space).

NEWS YOU CAN USE

Upcoming shows in 1989 include a possible autograph party with Big Wheeley and the Whitewalls, July 30th. They recently released a 45 rpm single with the Quotations song, "Imagination" on one side and the "Louie Louie" party Medley on the other (Louie, Louie, Hang on Sloopy, Wild Thing). Their album, "Imagine This" is slated for a July 4th release. Also in the works is a new record by Little Duck and the Drakes (Ramblin' Man - '62 and Every Beat of My Heart - '64.) When it becomes a reality, they will be at one of our shows selling and signing copies of their new material. Other members knowing of local artists/bands that have a new release pending, contact club president **DEREK SHAW** for lining up a potential autograph party.

Earlier this year, members that renewed their KRC membership were asked if they would be willing to assist the club in its operation. Those that indicated a positive response will be contacted shortly by one of the officers to discuss our needs and their areas of expertise. New members, or renewing members who didn't complete that question, can still get on the list by contacting club president **DEREK SHAW** at (717)843-3050. 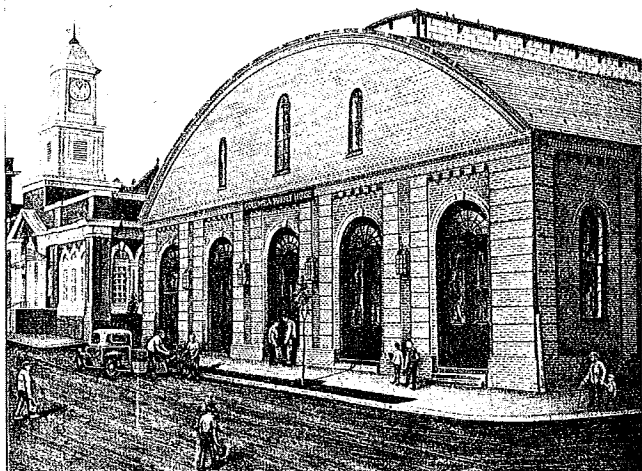
FACES IN THE CROWD

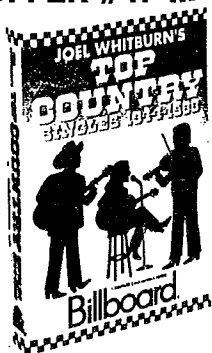
