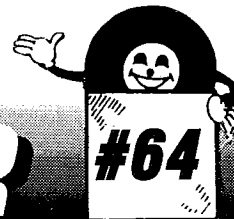

VIEW FROM THE TOP!

Vinyl may be dead in most retail stores in South Central Pennsylvania, however it is doing incredibly well at each of our shows at the Market House in Columbia. Our show has long been touted as "the" show for oldies music collectors with many "heavy" pieces surfacing. Yes, it continues to live up to that claim. As compact discs become more in demand, as well as digital audio tape (DAT) and any other yet undeveloped format comes along, our dealers will be there with the product. However, clearly 70% or more of the music available at our show is in the vinyl format. As long as the customers ask for it, our dealers will continue to supply it.

Plans are being made to again sponsor a "KRC Good 'Ole Days Swap Meet." This time, the event moves to Columbia and the home of members **Jack and Laurie Coons**. The picnic/swap is tentatively scheduled for Sunday, August 26th. This is in lieu of an August show. More details are contained in the "Two Much Fun" article below.

Also in this newsletter is another opportunity to purchase any of the Joel Whitburn/Record Research books at 40% off the cover price. This also includes their two latest offerings, *Daily Number One Hits* and *The 1960's Billboard Weekly Charts*. In the past, as incredible as it may seem, response has been slower than expected. If interested, act now.

Finally, those members attending our shows may have noticed the Market House going through some changes indoors during the past few months. The Boro of Columbia, although committed to the KRC is also committed to making the Market, which functions as a Market House every Friday and Saturday, more desirable to local patrons. The Boro is aware of our needs and concerns and plan to keep future changes minimal. The 1990 officer team is committed to the Market House. The facility has worked for us in the past, and we hope it will work for us throughout the rest of this decade.

VINYL RULES SUPREME at KRC shows, with over 70% of the available stock in that format. The next three shows are July 22nd, September 9th and October 14th.

OPEN FOR BUSINESS

Remember, our shows are scheduled to last from 9 AM to 4 PM. Occasionally, dealers have left early or have not been open for the entire show. To avoid this, you may want to bring along a helper that can watch your stand if you must "go shopping." Also, prior to 9 AM, you are allowed and encouraged to cover your stock if you are not at your stand.

EXPRESS LANE

It was decided at a recent meeting to limit parking in front of the Market House (Third Street - west side of building). THE SPACES ARE FOR UNLOADING PURPOSES ONLY BETWEEN 7 AND 9 AM. This will enable us to get more dealers in and out of the Market quickly. AGAIN, the parking lot behind the building (east side) is reserved for show customers. Dealers are to consult their procedures sheet for a listing of lots available for their use in addition to on-street parking.

NOTICE TO DEALERS

The current *Dealer Procedures* (March 1990) should be updated to contain the following item, under "Miscellaneous," #8: "Open display of obscene, objectionable, and sexually explicit material is forbidden." The current administration feels that due to the large number of children attending our shows, this policy is needed. If you must sell this type of merchandise, display it properly in good taste. Questions: See **Bob Atwater**, Marketmaster. This item is in effect and will be part of the next *Dealer Procedures* revision.

TAKE YOUR BUTT OUTSIDE

As a friendly reminder, since March 1989 the Columbia Market House has been a non-smoking facility. This rule was not imposed by the KRC. The Boro of Columbia, owners of the facility, implemented the policy due to insurance liability and a new Commonwealth of Pennsylvania statute. If you must have a smoke, please do so outside, and dispose of your butts properly. Better yet, make a resolution not to smoke at our shows and use the money you save to purchase more records for your collection!

VA VOOM *SABOOM*

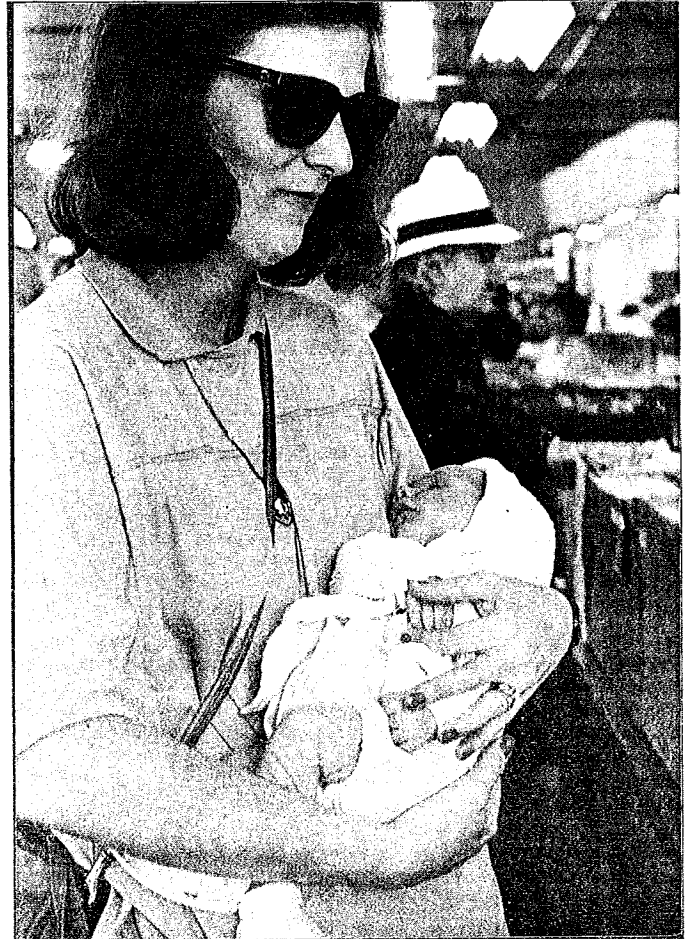

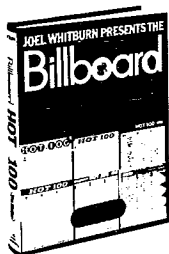
