Each show continues to draw more and new people. Unfortunately, the Boro of Columbia merchants haven't woken up and realized that this is the most successful best kept secret in their town of 11,237! (We have almost

as many people attend our show in a year as live in the entire town!)

### **KRC MONTHLY AUCTIONS**

The club now auctions music-related items. At each KRC show, we will auction at least one item. (For example, at the November 11th show, we auctioned an Elvis Sun label 45.) Here's how the auction works: We will have silent bid sheet and the auction item on display at the KRC stands (#116 & #117) until around 12:30 PM each show. Right before 1 PM, show announcer Denny Emerick will read the highest bid received and the bidder's name. Then he will play the auction item (if it is a record). Bidders will have one last chance to bid before they are closed. Bob Atwater will award the item to the highest bidder just after 1 PM. The Marketmaster will collect the money and take care of recording the amount of sale. 10-20% of each item auctioned goes to the club, the rest goes to the person who provided the item.

If you have an item you think would bring some money, and you no longer have any interest in it, you may want to consider participating in a future KRC auction. Everyone benefits - yourself, the club and the buyer. Scan your collection and see what you have! Auction items must be music-related (records, autographs, photographs, etc.)

Save the time, expense and trouble of doing a Goldmine or DISCoveries auction and do one at an uncoming KRC show. See Bob Atwater or Steve Yohe for details.

"This past October, a financial committee consisting of myself, Steve Yohe and Bob Atwater met to set dues and stand rental prices for the coming year. In analyzing our membership expenses for the past year, we found that we spent a little more than \$11 on each member and more than \$12 on each stand holder. Since our dues were \$10 and stand rentals were \$10, it is not hard to see that KRC was losing money. This, coupled with rising postal, advertising, and rental fees (Market House rent will increase 33% beginning in January 1991), has forced KRC to set new rates for the coming year. Membership has been raised to \$12, while each stand will now cost \$15. We hope that these modest increases will get the club back on its financial feet."


